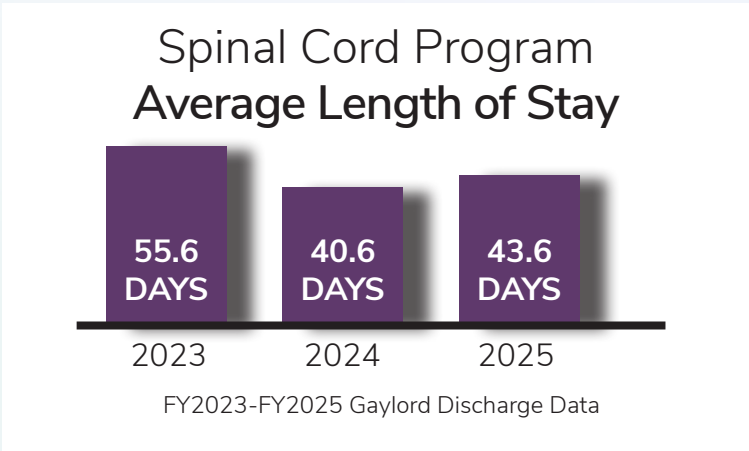
Since every spinal cord injury or illness affects a person differently, our **interdisciplinary team customizes** each program based on the patient's specific needs and discharge destination.
