THE RESEARCH ROUNDUP

PROJECT TITLE

HOUDINI: Reduction in Catheter Days Through Implementation of a Nurse-Driven Protocol

PROJECT LEAD: STEPHANIE CUBERO-PELLOT, RN

UNIT: HOOKER 1

PROJECT SUMMARY: This initiative implemented the HOUDINI protocol, an evidence-based, nurse-driven checklist for evaluating the ongoing need for urinary catheters. The goal:

- » Empower nurses to make timely decisions around catheter removal
- » Reduce catheter-associated urinary tract infections (CAUTIs)
- » Improve patient outcomes by enhancing nursing autonomy

WHAT INSPIRED THIS PROJECT?

"I became involved in research through the Nurse Residency Program, which emphasized the importance of evidence-based practice in improving patient care."

The team identified a gap in the existing catheter removal process and was motivated to design a nurse-led solution that could deliver measurable results.

THE PROBLEM

"We observed that existing policies did not adequately empower nurses to initiate timely catheter removal when clinically appropriate."

Prolonged use of indwelling catheters:

- Increases infection risk
- Extends hospital stays
- Raises healthcare costs

At the time of the project, CAUTI rates were above institutional benchmarks.

THE APPROACH

"Our objective was to evaluate whether equipping nurses with a standardized protocol would reduce catheter days and help us meet our goal of fewer than four CAUTIs annually."

Steps Taken:

- Rolled out the HOUDINI checklist
- Delivered targeted staff education
- Updated EMR workflows
- Introduced a new badge buddy for quick reference

KEY FINDINGS

- ✓ Significant reduction in catheter days
- ✓ Nurses quickly and confidently integrated the protocol into their daily workflow

"One surprising insight was how easily the protocol was integrated into [daily] practice once nurses understood its rationale."

IMPACT ON PATIENTS & STAFF

For patients:

- Lower risk of infection and complications
- Shorter, safer hospital stays

For nurses:

- Greater autonomy
- Boosted confidence in clinical decisions
- Stronger collaboration with the care team
- Heightened awareness of infection prevention

The Urinary Catheter Disappearing Act Assessment:

HOUDINI

Does your patient meet this criteria?

Hematuria - Frank, gross, CBI

Obstruction - i.e. BPH

Urology - Or other recent injury/surgery

Decubitus Sacral Ulcer - Open sacral or perianal wound in an incontinent patient, approved by wound care team

Input/Output - Strict I&O, hourly fluid balance

Nursing - Palliative Care

Immobility - Unstable fracture

If NO is the answer to the above criteria, then make that indwelling urinary catheter

DISAPPEAR!

ADVICE FOR ASPIRING RESEARCHERS "Start with a clinical issue you care about. Engage early with interdisciplinary teams. Ensure your project is evidence-based and feasible. Lean on nurse educators for mentorship. **Most importantly**, don't hesitate to be part of the change that benefits patients."

LANGUAGE SHIFT: INCLUSIVE TERMS

Language is powerful. The words we choose can either reinforce old stereotypes or open the door to a more welcoming, inclusive environment.

We encourage everyone to reflect on common workplace language and update phrases that may be unintentionally exclusive.

Try this swap:

- **Instead of:** "Manpower"

Try: Workforce, Staff, or Team Members

Why? Terms like "manpower" center one gender and exclude others. Inclusive and gender-neutral language shows respect for all.

LGBTQ+ INCLUSION IN HEALTHCARE

June is Pride Month—a celebration of the LGBTQ+ community and a call to recognize the importance of affirming care in all spaces, especially healthcare.

At Gaylord, inclusive care means more than just clinical expertise—it means honoring the full identity of every patient, visitor, and team member.

Here's how we can continue to foster inclusive care:

- **Ask, don't assume.** Confirm a patient's name and pronouns. Using "they" or "partner" by default avoids assumptions about gender or orientation.
- **Reflect inclusion in documentation.** Use forms that offer more than binary gender options and recognize non-traditional family structures
- **Understand unique health needs.** LGBTQ+ individuals, especially transgender people, face higher rates of discrimination, mental health challenges, and barriers to care. Culturally competent care improves outcomes and trust.

Tip: If you're unsure about someone's pronouns, try saying, "Hi, I'm [Your Name], and I use she/her pronouns. How about you?" It's a simple way to show respect and build rapport.

HONORING JUNETEENTH: A LEGACY OF FREEDOM

Juneteenth (June 19) marks the day in 1865 when enslaved people in Galveston, Texas were informed of their freedom—more than two years after the Emancipation Proclamation was signed. It's a moment of celebration, but also reflection.


Why Juneteenth matters in healthcare:

- **Historical trauma has health implications.** Black Americans have faced generations of systemic injustice that continue to impact access, trust, and health outcomes.
- **Representation matters.** Inclusive hiring, leadership development, and community engagement help address disparities and build equity.
- **We can act.** Educate yourself, support Black-owned businesses, amplify Black voices, and reflect on how our own practices and assumptions may need to shift.


