Since joining Gaylord in 2023, Blake Gagliardi has become a steady source of compassion, support, and leadership for both patients and staff. Colleagues describe her as “*an incredible asset*” whose empathy and dedication consistently go above and beyond.

One nominator shared how Blake made herself available after hours and even came in on a Saturday to support a young patient with PTSD during an especially difficult time. Whether she is sitting with patients and families through hard conversations, collaborating with therapists after hours, or simply making herself available when someone needs help, Blake is known for making people feel supported and cared for.

Her supervisor, Sarah Bullard, says Blake “*embodies the hospital’s core values in quiet, understated ways that are consistently meaningful.*” Blake currently manages two inpatient units and is widely respected for balancing professionalism and productivity with genuine compassion.

One of Blake’s most meaningful contributions has been establishing and leading Gaylord’s Hospice Committee after recognizing the need for a more consistent approach to end-of-life care. Drawing on her background in hospice care, she helped create new processes to better support patients, families, and staff during some of life’s most difficult moments. She also launched a thoughtful legacy program that gives families meaningful keepsakes such as hand-holding photographs, fingerprint mementos, and condolence cards from staff.

Blake’s impact reaches far beyond her day-to-day responsibilities. She mentors students, supports coworkers through complex situations, contributes ideas that improve patient care, and approaches every interaction with calmness and kindness. As one colleague shared, she is “*compassionate, empathic, dedicated, and reliable,*” while another simply described her as a “*rock star.*”

Since joining Gaylord in 2022, Alicia Hagan has become a beloved member of the Milne 2 team, known for her positivity, compassion, and unwavering dedication to her patients and coworkers.

Colleagues describe Alicia as someone who “*puts 110% into every patient she cares for.*” She is known for noticing the small details others might miss, from nutritional concerns to outdated orders, and always works to make sure patients receive the best possible care and support.

Her nurse manager, Courtney Raynor, shared that Alicia “*doesn’t just show up for her shifts; she brings her whole heart to her work.*” Her signature “*Okay, let’s do this!*” attitude helps create a supportive, team-focused environment, even on the busiest days.

Alicia is especially known for the meaningful connections she builds with patients and families. She takes the time to learn what motivates each person and finds thoughtful ways to brighten difficult days. One nominator recalled how Alicia brought a patient a cup of Dunkin’ coffee to lift their spirits and encourage them to participate in therapy. It was a small gesture, but one that left a lasting impact.

Coworkers know Alicia as the person always asking, “*How can I help?*” Whether she is assisting with admissions, helping teammates, floating to another unit, or advocating for a patient, she consistently steps in wherever she is needed with professionalism and kindness.

Currently pursuing her RN degree at Albertus Magnus College, Alicia continues to invest in her own growth while also supporting and encouraging those around her. Her positivity, compassion, and dedication to nursing excellence recently earned her one of Gaylord’s 2026 Nightingale Awards, a recognition that reflects the impact she has on patients, families, and coworkers every day.

Building the Future of Neurologic Physical Therapy

New Neuro PT Mentorship Program Launching June 8

Gaylord Specialty Healthcare is starting a new Neurologic Physical Therapy Mentorship Program in June. This program will help new physical therapy graduates build their neurologic rehab skills through hands-on learning and guidance from our experienced clinical teams.

The new program includes:

- A 16-week paid mentorship experience
- Rotations through both Inpatient and Outpatient Physical Therapy
- Eight weeks in each setting to provide exposure across the continuum of care
- Direct mentorship from rehabilitation leaders and neurologic PT clinical experts
- Focused development of advanced neurologic rehabilitation skills, clinical reasoning, and confidence as new clinicians transition into practice

The program officially begins on June 8, and two participants have already accepted offers to join the inaugural cohort.

Nicole Frey, PT, serves as Program Coordinator for the initiative, which reflects Gaylord's continued commitment to mentorship, professional development, and exceptional patient care.

In Development: New Residency Program for Neuro PT

Gaylord is beginning an exciting new chapter in neurologic rehabilitation education and clinical excellence. A group of inpatient and outpatient physical therapists is currently working together to develop a Neurologic Physical Therapy Residency Program.

To support this effort, Gaylord has promoted Marielle Mikos, PT, DPT, NCS to guide the program's development as the Neurologic Physical Therapy Program Director. The team anticipates the potential launch of an initial resident cohort in 2027, with possible program accreditation in 2028.

A physical therapy residency is a mentorship program for licensed physical therapists who want to specialize and build their skills in a specific area. Residents learn from experienced clinicians, develop advanced clinical skills, and gain experience in research, education, and leadership. These programs help prepare skilled clinicians and improve care for patients and families.

Although the residency program is still being developed, Gaylord's therapy teams are already excited about it. The program will help train the next generation of neurologic rehabilitation specialists and strengthen Gaylord's reputation as a leader in complex rehabilitation care.

I asked the patient if she would like someone to stay with her. She shook her head no, but Andrea insisted on staying with her. She pulled up a chair, sat next to the patient, held her hand, and even put on the prayer service she enjoyed watching on her phone.

I have worked in healthcare for over 15 years, and this is one of the best RNs I have ever met. So often in our field, we forget what is important and why we are here, and sometimes we can't empathize with what our patients are going through. Andrea is a great example of how we should all act and function as healthcare professionals. She also has great communication skills and is willing to brainstorm solutions to help her patients feel more comfortable. She is a breath of fresh air and a great asset to have on Milne 1."

Think First: Empowering Students to Prevent Injury

Katie Zimmerli, Gaylord Hospital Think First Education Coordinator, recently spent two sessions with students at Sheehan High School, focusing on the importance of injury prevention and making safe choices.

Traumatic injuries remain the leading cause of death among teenagers, with teens and young adults representing the highest-risk group. The most common causes include motor vehicle crashes, violence, falls, and sports or recreational activities. Among the most serious are injuries to the brain and spinal cord, which can result in long-term or permanent disabilities affecting a person's ability to think, speak, walk, move, or even breathe as they once did. The encouraging news is that many of these injuries are preventable through basic safety precautions and informed decision-making.

Katie, who is an Occupational Therapist in Inpatient, presented on a range of critical topics, including traffic safety, awareness of high-risk behaviors, basic anatomy and injury mechanics, and the core principles of the Think First philosophy.



“My message to students is to think first about the potential consequences of their actions,” Katie shared. “I want them to avoid potential life-altering injury and protect themselves from permanent harm.”

Gaylord is proud to have Katie's passion and dedication to injury prevention education. Through her work, hundreds of Connecticut youth have gained valuable knowledge and a deeper understanding of how to stay safe and make thoughtful choices.



What is an RL?

An RL report is a safety event report submitted through the RLDatix system (often called RL6). Healthcare staff use it to document incidents, near misses, or safety concerns like falls, medication errors, equipment issues, or other events that could impact patients, visitors, or staff.

The goal is to identify risks, track trends, and improve safety. Reports are reviewed by leadership or investigators so issues can be addressed and processes improved, not to punish staff.

What happens after I submit an RL?!

- Your RL is reviewed by the quality and safety team, your manager, and the manager of any other department involved in the occurrence (RL).
- Feedback is provided by each person reviewing the RL.
- Depending on the severity of the occurrence, your RL may be escalated up the chain of command to resolve the concern.
- Once the RL is “closed,” your manager can provide you with an update on the outcome. Please ask your manager about any follow-up questions or updates as you will not get automatic updates.
- *NOTE*: If your RL includes an equipment issue – please also submit a work order! An RL does not take the place of a work order and will not initiate a follow up from facilities.

Meet Jared Murano, Featured Adaptive Athlete of the 2026 Gaylord Gauntlet



"I once heard that every man has two lives – and that the second begins when he realizes he only has one.

In July 2025, I was a US Merchant Mariner and a former 3rd officer and surface rescue swimmer for the US Navy's Military Sealift Command. I was trained to sail ships of any size, horsepower, or tonnage in the world, rescue those in danger, and push my body to its limits.

I had already faced more than most 28-year-olds, having lost my father to brain cancer two years earlier, but I was moving forward ... until the day when everything stopped.

Last June, I had a life-threatening seizure at sea. I was airlifted to a hospital in Hawaii, where I was diagnosed with a rare, tennis-ball-sized brain tumor called an astrocytoma that had grown undetected for years.

I returned home to Connecticut for surgery. Doctors were able to remove 97% of the cancer, but that was only the beginning. I had to rebuild everything: my strength, my independence, my life.

That's why I came to Gaylord Hospital.

I spent a month in inpatient rehabilitation, relearning what I had always taken for granted: standing, walking, and using my left side. Going from peak physical condition to a wheelchair took a massive emotional toll. There were moments I felt defeated, but my Gaylord team of doctors,

nurses, and therapists never let me give up.

With their guidance and Gaylord's amazing technologies, I quickly began to rebuild strength. Gaylord gave me so many additional opportunities to try, from high-intensity cardio groups, weightlifting, and adaptive cooking classes, to archery and basketball. I said 'yes' to everything before I went home four weeks later using only a walker.

I returned to Gaylord for outpatient rehab, a routine I continue to this day. Aquatic therapy is the highlight of my week. In the pool, I feel a sense of freedom that's hard to describe. I'm more like myself again, more like the Navy rescue swimmer I once was.

Less than one year after my brain surgery, I will take on the Gaylord Gauntlet as the 2026 Featured Adaptive Athlete - navigating 24 obstacles over a 5k course alongside the same therapists who have guided me through my own recovery challenges.

Though I'm still undergoing chemotherapy to treat any remaining cancer, thanks to Gaylord, I have the tools and the confidence to move forward one step at a time in this second life I have been given.

Thank you, all, for your support and I look forward to seeing you at the Gaylord Gauntlet!"
