Fourth Quarter is Care Nominees Announced

Four recipients of the Quarterly Nominations for the Joseph A. Lindenmayer Employee of the Year were recently announced. This group is the fourth of this recognition cycle for 2024. It is our employees who make Gaylord so special for our patients. Whether providing direct patient care or providing the myriad of support to the caregiver teams, each employee is vital to our success and to our mission of improving the health and functionality of our patients. Our core values spell ICARE: Integrity, Compassion, Accountability, Respect and Excellence. In its deliberations of the candidates, the Committee constantly reflected upon the importance of respect, not only for patients and families, but also for co-workers.



The first nominee is **Jennifer Kleinschmidt**. Jennifer is a Care Manager. She has been with Gaylord since July 1999 and was nominated by a coworker.

The co-worker states,"I would like to nominate Jennifer Kleinschmidt, Care Manager on Milne, for an ICARE award. Jen is the Care Manager that I would want for my own family. She fights for her patients and is an amazing advocate. I can think of many examples of her dedication to her

patients, but one that stands out happened recently. Jen received a phone call on a Saturday afternoon from the nursing supervisor stating that the recently discharged patient did not have her nebulizer, which she needs 3x a day. Jen immediately called the respiratory company but could not correct their error on a Saturday. She called multiple pharmacies and medical supply stores with no luck. She was not going to give up and ended up bringing a nebulizer that she had at home to the patient's house. She and the patient could FaceTime with respiratory to ensure the device was set up correctly.

This is just one example of how dedicated Jen is. She works with integrity every day and passionately fights for what is best for all her patients. Jen's compassion is evident in her work, as she has been recognized multiple times through the Gaylord Star Program by patients and families expressing their appreciation. She encompasses the ICARE values in her day-to-day work and deserves this nomination."

Jen's supervisor Chris Babina states,"Any one of us would want Jen Kleinschmidt to be our Care Manager! Jen has been a staff nurse at Gaylord for a number of years and has worked as a Care Manager for about seven years. Becoming a member of the Care Management team, Jen accepted her position without question, working with the medically complex population in Milne. She has totally submerged herself as a Care Manager, absorbing knowledge like a sponge in developing her expertise. Jen has incorporated the ICARE values of integrity, compassion, accountability, respect, and excellence into her daily practice. This is evident by the ICARE nomination Jen received from a colleague who noted, "Jen is the care manager that I would want for my own family. She fights for her patients and is an amazing advocate."

This nomination referenced a particularly complicated patient scenario. The discharge itself had been very involved, requiring a lot of leg work, coordination between vendors, and multiple phone calls to make it a reality for this patient, who desired to return to her home. Everything was set, or so it was thought, and the patient was discharged to her home as scheduled. Unfortunately, one of the durable medical equipment (DME) providers did not follow through to deliver a nebulizer, which was critical to maintaining this patient's respiratory status to avoid readmission to acute care. Being a weekend made the situation even more dire, and Jen was unsuccessful in securing a nebulizer from either the original DME provider or an alternate. Determined to keep her patient home and free from distress, Jen brought a nebulizer from her house to the patient. She contacted the Director of Respiratory Therapy to ensure proper device setup.

The scenario described is only one example of Jen going "above and beyond" for her patients, as it has been repeated multiple times, whether it is a weekday, weekend, or after-hours. Her colleague notes that Jen "works with integrity every day and passionately fights for what is best for all her patients." It is with great pleasure to recognize Jen. Gaylord is fortunate to have an employee like her, and I fully support her nomination.



Our second nominee is **Kate McNelly.** Kate is an IT Applications Analyst II. Kate started with Gaylord in August 2015 and was hired as an RN on Hooker 2. A co-worker nominated her.

The co-worker states, "I am blown away by Kate's work in the Expanse builds for therapy. She has been so collaborative and truly seems to understand our workflow and documentation needs. She is always available to troubleshoot and will Zoom or meet with us on short notice. In our fast-paced day, having someone so capable and reliable to resolve our issues and needs has been incredibly helpful. Kate is committed, supportive, reliable, and excellent at what she does!"

Kate's supervisor Val Acabbo states, "I absolutely support Kate for this nomination. It has truly been wonderful having Kate on the IT Applications team. Maddy joined the inpatient therapy department in June 2020 to cover a maternity leave during an incredibly challenging summer. certainly is no surprise she was nominated for this deserving award from a previous patient.



Our final nominee is **Joy Savulak.** Joy is our Publicist. She has been with Gaylord since 2011 as a consultant and became a Gaylord employee in September 2023. A colleague nominated her.

The colleague states, "Joy is the epitome of Gaylord's spirit. Her job is getting Gaylord's name "out there." She does so with a smile and is so proud of the organization she represents. 
"I love being part of the Gaylord family and taking part alongside the different teams in my patients' journeys toward better health."

Escape Room



Both received a signed certificate of recognition from the Milne Institute's Executive Director, Pete Grevelding.





Be Innovative. Think Possible. The GOT-Cog won the second annual Innovation of the Year Award on Monday, May 13 kicking off Hospital Week festivities, besting over 120 other nominations. The GOT-Cog's innovative approach towards problem-solving, process improvement, product development, and growth across the organization was recognized, with finalists including nursing competency validation, vestibular and vision rehab exercises posters, and a paper reduction system.

In 2021, Emily Meise, MS OTR/L saw a need for an OT-derived cognition screen and approached the research department for their help in creating one. Together, Emily and the research department worked with an internal expert panel to refine Emily's initial draft, resulting in the creation of the

Gaylord Occupational Therapy Cognitive (GOT-Cog©) Screen. This tool has 24 items that represent 9 domains of cognition typically impacted by brain injury, stroke, and hospitalization, including: Verbal Fluency, Attention, Orientation, Delayed Recall, Visuospatial, Divided Attention, Auditory Memory, Sequencing, and Functional Problem Solving.

Today After 2.5 years, the GOT-Cog has been developed and is the current assessment of record for Gaylord's inpatient OT department. A multiphase study was conducted to evaluate the validity (accuracy), reliability (precision), and responsiveness (change over time) of GOT-Cog. From this study, one manuscript was published in the American Journal of Occupational Therapy, with a second currently being considered for peer review, and at least two more on the way. Following the initial manuscript, Emily and the research department have been contacted by other OT practitioners and and investigators across the US and internationally for more information on the measure.

This level of support, especially on the off shifts, is critical in developing our novice nurses and helping them feel secure when facing new situations. We are fortunate to have Beth as a supervisor."

Help Protect Gaylord from Cyber Attacks

Recent attacks against the healthcare sector are increasing. Change Healthcare and Ascension are just the latest in targeted attacks. Experts are aware of new targeted attacks and methods which have prompted officials to release new cyber security bulletins to all healthcare-related organizations in the United States.

Attacks are predominantly through email phishing. Gaylord is not immune to attacks. Do not think that because we are small, they're not going to attack us.

What can you do to help protect Gaylord?

- 1. Be mindful of the email you open and especially the links you click on. If it looks suspicious, don't open it. If it's from someone you don't recognize, don't open it. Don't download anything without checking with IT first!
- 2. Never give your password to someone!
- 3. Logoff! Do NOT leave unattended sessions logged on.
- 4. Report suspect activity to IT immediately.





A near miss is an event that might have resulted in harm but the problem did not reach the patient because of timely intervention by our amazing staff.

The Safety Coaches have selected the Near Miss submitted in March by Ryann Collette, Gaylord Pharmacist. The incident impacted a new admission with a medication ordered that was Non-Formulary. Non-Formulary medications require the patient to supply the med, however the medication was not identified in the preadmission process. Ryann was in contact with the previous facility's pharmacist in attempt to obtain medication and provided education to Gaylord LP and Admissions on the Non-formulary medication process. After investigating, they were able to obtain medication from previous Gaylord stock and patient did not miss a dose. This is a an example of the use of **CHAMP** tool **Mentoring Each** other, 200% Accountability and use of CHAMP tool, Cross Check and Coach Teammates to prevent future incidents.
