


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Lighting Hope AT GAYLORD

Kara often takes the time to interact with patients, helping to create a welcoming and compassionate environment. We've even received recent compliments from patients about her. I fully support her nomination."



Keegan is an 11-year-old Bichon Frise certified through Pet Partners as a therapy dog. Together with her handler, Madeline, a retired nurse and long-time guide dog raiser, this team brings comfort and joy to patients and staff alike.

When you'll see them:

- Pet Therapy visits take place Fridays between 1–2 PM, with support from the Therapeutic Recreation Department.
- Visits are flexible based on patient needs and availability.

How to request a visit:

If you have a patient who would benefit from a visit from Keegan, please contact **Therapeutic Recreation** (ext. 2732) with the patient's name and room number.

(No staff involvement is needed for handling; TR and Volunteer Services coordinate all visits.)

Important reminders:

- Keegan can visit rooms with **blue signs** (screened/OK for pet therapy).
- No visits to rooms with yellow, purple, brown, or droplet precaution signs.
- Keegan is hypoallergenic, but please still be mindful of allergies.
- Pet Therapy visits are documented in the patient's chart.
