The report highlighted **Natasha Dempsey, IT Support Coordinator**, for Practicing a Questioning Attitude when she noticed a lab courier drop off a blood product to the lab—something that should be delivered directly to

the patient's nursing unit due to time-sensitive administration requirements.

Tasha **ARCC'd up** her concern and contacted Alyssa, who confirmed the delivery time, educated the courier, and notified the unit nurse. Their quick action prevented waste of the blood product and ensured the patient received a timely transfusion.

**RECOGNITION:** IMPORTANCE OF 2 PATIENT IDENTIFIERS

The Safety Coaches selected an additional Near Miss from August that underscores why verifying two patient identifiers is essential. While verifying Total Parenteral Nutrition (TPN) prior to administration, two RNs discovered that the bag sent was intended for a patient on another unit. They immediately notified the appropriate floor and confirmed the infusions had been switched—preventing a serious error before it reached the patient.

**PROJECT TITLE** 

TeleSitter® Program: Reducing Falls and Costs in the LTACH

Setting

PROJECT LEAD: NICOLE MORRILL, MSN, RN UNIT: LYMAN 1

**PROJECT SUMMARY:** Gaylord Specialty Healthcare implemented a continuous video monitoring system—known as the **TeleSitter® program**—to address patient safety challenges in the long-term acute care hospital (LTACH) setting. The initiative aimed to reduce inpatient falls and the need for costly 1:1 sitters while maintaining high levels of care and staff efficiency.

#### WHAT INSPIRED THIS PROJECT?

Falls are among the most frequent and serious patient safety events in healthcare. In the LTACH environment—where patients are encouraged to regain mobility early in recovery—the risk is even higher. Meanwhile, 1:1 sitters are both laborintensive and financially unsustainable. Gaylord's team sought an innovative, scalable solution that would preserve safety while easing staffing demands.

#### THE APPROACH

Using continuous virtual monitoring technology, Gaylord introduced a TeleSitter® program that allows trained staff to observe multiple patients at once and quickly alert onunit nurses if intervention is needed. Over a 20-month period, data was collected and compared to historical benchmarks.

#### **IMPACT ON PATIENTS & STAFF**

#### For patients:

- Fewer falls and related injuries
- Enhanced sense of safety and support

#### For nurses:

- Reduced workload strain
- Improved situational awareness
- Greater confidence in patient monitoring

#### KEY FINDINGS

- √ Falls decreased from an average of 17.2 to 12.9 per month.
- ✓ Sitter hours dropped from 1,428 to just 140 per month.
- ✓ Annual savings exceeded \$3.2 million.

The TeleSitter® system proved to be a cost-effective, high-impact intervention for patient safety and resource optimization.

#### **TAKEAWAY**

The study shows how technology can enhance patient safety and resource management in the LTACH setting—demonstrating how data-driven innovation benefits both patients and providers.

Clinics will be held from **Monday, October 13th through Friday, November 14th** in Brooker Lecture Hall, facilitated by Griffin Hospital.

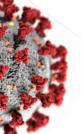
Griffin Hospital will also be offering high–dose for those staff that are 65 and over and will accept all health insurances.



#### Important Reminder:

Griffin Hospital still requires all employees to bring an <u>ACTUAL PHOTOCOPY</u> of their insurance <u>card-front and back</u> to any of the flu clinics. Staff at the clinics <u>will not</u> have the ability to make photo copies for employees arriving to get their flu vaccine and may be turned away.
